Manager's Corner



The Grayhawk Community Association and the Retreat Village Association have had a very busy summer working on numerous community projects throughout the past several months. Below is an update on some of these projects:

- The new readers at the entry gates throughout the Retreat Village that have been recently installed are working very well and the feedback from homeowners has been overwhelmingly positive. Approximately 2,800 new transponders have been installed to date.
- The Board-approved street sealing project in the Halcon Villas, Halcon Vistas, Halcon Retreat, Volare, and Crown Point Norte neighborhoods began on September 9 and concluded on
- The new stone style and stone caps have been installed at the monument signs located on the NW corner of Thompson Peak Parkway and Pima Road, Scottsdale Road and Thompson Peak Parkway, the two signs at Grayhawk Drive and Scottsdale Road, Hayden Road and Deer Valley Road, and the Raptor and Talon Retreat entry gates. The stone caps have also been installed on the new stone on the neighborhood monument signs in Montevina, Windsong, Pinnacle, Coventry at the Park, Coventry at Grayhawk on Grayhawk Drive, and Coventry at Grayhawk on 76th Street, which completes these monument signs. The new stone has been applied to the Monterey Park and Featherwind monument signs with the stone caps scheduled to be installed soon. Graphic Directions, Inc. (GDI) is currently working on the renovation of the monument signs in the Talon Retreat and the new stone is currently being installed on these monument signs. This portion of the project is scheduled to be completed in October.
- Advanced Painting has begun the stucco repairs on the exterior of the Avian common area walls and is scheduled to
- The GCA Board approved engaging Studio KZ as the architect for the guardhouse renovation project. The revised contract was approved by the GCA Board of Directors at the September 9 GCA Board meeting.
- Board-approved DLC Resources landscaping projects:
 - Deer Valley wash drop structure clean out has been completed.
 - Drainage and erosion repair project on the south side Thompson Peak Parkway between Hayden Road and Grayhawk
 - Drainage and erosion repair project on the north side of Thompson Peak Parkway between 78th Street and 76th Street
 - Montevina NAOS fire mitigation project and cleanout for the painting project has been completed.
 - Fire mitigation project between the Monterey Retreat neighborhood and the Cachet at Grayhawk condominium development is scheduled to be completed in early October.
 - Sidewalk edge erosion project and culvert headwalls project is underway.
 - Erosion repair project along the greenbelt adjacent to the power line corridor is underway.

On another subject, this is the time of year that we will begin having many of our biggest events. On Saturday, October 26, we will be having our annual Pumpkin Patch event in the Monterey Park greenbelt located near Whistling Wind Way and 73rd Way. Also, on November 3, we will be having a Sunday in the Park event in the Grayhawk greenbelt near the GCA office at the corner 78th Way and 78th Place. This event will feature food from local restaurants, live music, games and crafts, as well a lots of other activities to make sure it is a fun-filled Sunday afternoon. Please mark your calendars for these and many of our other events this fall season. I hope to see you there.

DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

David Van Omen reported that the Lennar homes being built at the corner of Pinnacle Peak Road and Miller Road are slated to be open by March or April of 2020.

OPERATIONAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

Stacey Harvey reported the committee had discussed a few thefts from vehicles that had occurred within the community. Vehicles involved were unlocked. Management will continue to remind residents of ways that they can help keep the community

The Retreat Village gate reader transition went well over the summer.

The committee discussed ongoing compliance issues and determined that many of the problems are a result of homeowners not submitting the Architectural Review Committee before making changes to the exterior of their home.

LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

Arlene Smith reported that DLC Resources is in process of transitioning the turf from Bermuda grass to rye grass for the winter. There is a map that highlights which areas will not be overseeded that can be found on the community website.

A large, prominent tree blew over at the NW corner of Hayden Road and Thompson Peak Parkway earlier this year. Management will be looking into options to decorate that corner during the holiday season due to the lack of the tree.

COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT COMMITTEE

Stacey Harvey reported that the committee did not meet.

EVENT PLANNING COMMITTEE

Sarah Van Duyne reported that approximately 25 people attended the Brunch and Bubbly event and had a great time.

Upcoming events include Paws at the Park, Pumpkin Patch and Sunday in the Park. Paws at the Park will include a DJ, pet portraits, pet adoptions a prize raffle and much more.

Pumpkin Patch is always a popular event that features creepy crawlies from Deb's Dragons, food and a variety of activities.

NEW BUSINESS

A motion was made and approved to accept the holiday light proposal from Custom Holiday Lights, which includes a \$5,000.00 discount, at a cost of \$44,218.30 to be paid from the GCA Community Enhancement Fund.

A motion was made and approved to accept the revised guardhouse renovation architect services contract.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Jeanette Griswold reported that year-to-date income is over budget. Year-to-date expenses are also over budget, primarily due to legal expenses, collections expenses, and increased water expenses due to the lack of rain this summer.

MANAGEMENT REPORT

New stone and caps have been installed at main intersections and the contractor is starting to install the new stone at the neighborhood monument signs.

Painting of the common area walls and fences in the Talon Retreat is complete.







The Benefits of Not Overseeding

Late September to mid-October marks a major milestone for turf landscape in the desert. It's the time that those who want to maintain green parks and lawns through the winter need to overseed Bermuda grass with winter Ryegrass. It's also the time to thoughtfully decide which areas to not overseed and allow going fully dormant in the winter in order to have lush, strong Bermuda grass in the spring.

In 2013, the Grayhawk Community Association approved implementing a process of NOT overseeding certain areas within the community each year. Each year, designated areas throughout the community do not go through the overseeding process, which allows for a better quality of spring turf. The locations that are not overseeded rotate based on a four-year schedule, which can be found on grayhawkcommunity.org under Resident Services/ Landscaping/Landscape Articles.

What to Expect in Non-Overseeded Areas

Bermuda grass can stay green until the first frost, usually late November or early December. The grass in the selected nonoverseeded areas will start to turn a brown, blonde, straw like appearance. This is the natural dormancy cycle of the Bermuda grass and is not the result of irrigation problems. Around the middle to end of March, when nighttime temperatures begin to approach 60 degrees, Bermuda will start to grow again and will return to a regular mow and care cycle.

The Science Behind It All

Overseeding in the fall does not allow Bermuda grass to complete its normal growing cycle before winter dormancy approaches. Much like a bear preparing for hibernation, Bermuda

spends the weeks and months prior to the cold season storing the reserves it needs to keep its roots and stems alive through the winter. Overseeding interrupts this process, and often die-back results in the root system. The effects of interrupting this process are seen in the spring when weather conditions are right for Bermuda to begin growing again. The thick, tall Ryegrass will keep the Bermuda shaded and cool, which prolongs the dormancy period. By keeping the Bermuda dormant longer, the percentage of Bermuda that runs out of food before it can begin to photosynthesize increases.

When the Bermuda does come out of dormancy, it must contend with the Ryegrass for nutrients while the Ryegrass is at its strongest. Ryegrass is a fierce competitor for all the resources required for Bermuda to grow: sunlight, water, nutrients and even oxygen. During early spring, the Bermuda is at a disadvantage during the time it should be strengthening to withstand the extreme heat and dryness of a typical Arizona summer. By mid-summer, the Ryegrass dies out and physically impedes the Bermuda's ability to spread. The dead Ryegrass must be removed through dethatching, which may further injure and set back the Bermuda. In most cases, the Bermuda does not get the time needed to recover because overseeding starts again in just a few weeks. We recommend suspending the overseeding process for at least one season to help restore the root system and nutrients of the Bermuda grass.

Landscaping

Potted Flowers and Care

This fall you may be considering adding new plants to your home, either inside or out. While many shrubs and trees will be planted directly into the ground, there are also numerous options for potted plants. Potting allows for a wide variety of plants to be placed in a more favorable soil while also having the benefit of growing inside a controlled space.

Where desert plants are groomed to withstand harsh environments with little care, these flowers will require more frequent attention, especially in regards to fertilization and watering. The potted flowers should be fertilized once every two to three weeks during the warm blooming seasons. When selecting a fertilizer to use, look for a 20-20-20 compound as this may differ from your usual fertilizer.

The plants should also be watered once or twice per day, depending on their location. A plant placed in heavy sunlight or another very warm location will require more water than one that is not receiving sunlight as frequently or is in a cooler location.

After blooming season, the dead blooms should be removed completely, as opposed to waiting for them fall off naturally. This allows for new blooms to grow unobstructed in the next warm season.

Throughout Grayhawk, you will find a variety of potted plants across your landscape. Our crews change these pots, along with flower beds, twice yearly to coincide with proper blooming seasons. Below are several plants you will find throughout the year in your community, and that you may consider adding to your home.

Angelonias

These flowers bloom in a variety of colors including, pink, white and blue. They are relatively tall, usually growing to approximately 20 inches. This makes them excellent as a backdrop flower or a center flower within a round arrangement.



This desert plant is an excellent border flower with its low height and vibrant yellow flowers. The Golden Fleece grows to be approximately 7 inches tall with a similar width. The plant spreads seeds often, allowing for frequent blooming throughout warm seasons.

Potato Vine

Despite the name, you will not find any vegetables attached to this vine as the plant derives its name from the resemblance between its roots and sweet potatoes. The potato vine may grow as high as one foot and will typically display either light green or dark purple leaves.

Geranium

Geraniums are a great option for fall and winter. They come in a variety of colors like red, white and pink. They are a tall flower that grows to be about 10-12 inches. This makes it a great flower to layer behind smaller annuals. Geraniums grow in full sun and do not require shade.

Aiming High

The last thing an Agave does before it dies is send up its flower stalk. That seems unnatural, doesn't it? Why would a plant send up its last, best, and sometimes only opportunity for reproduction shortly before its death? Because it has no choice.

The Backstory

Agaves can produce either new leaves or a flower stem from their centers, but they cannot do both and remain alive. Next time you see an Agave flower stalk, pay attention to the base of the plant. As the stalk grows, the base begins to die back. That Agave is using every ounce of its reserves to flower. It is literally killing itself to bloom. Yes, this makes us momentarily sad but it is also essential to the life cycle of an Agave.

The really cool part of this final burst of energy is that these flower stalks are unique to each Agave species. In general, the larger the Agave, the taller its stalk. Some of these can grow up to 35' in a matter of weeks. They look like giant spears of Asparagus until they branch out - often candelabra-style - and ultimately bloom.

Whenever I see these, I pay close attention because the stalks can become vulnerable and dangerous. It isn't uncommon for the weight of the stalk to pull the plant out of the ground. In high winds they can tip over and create a hazard to whatever is within reach. More often than not, they will be removed before that happens which is a shame. To see them fully extended is other-worldly.

Agave geminiflora

Speaking of otherworldly, how about this? This doesn't look like an Agave, but it is. Meet the Agave geminiflora.

Take a look at the base of this plant. This agave sports hundreds of leaves and looks more like an herbaceous shrub. It doesn't produce pups (or offsets) so, once it flowers, it needs to be replaced.

When it does flower, the stalk is slim and grows to be about 15' and as it emerges, it is reminiscent of a sea urchin. Also, note the contrast between the base color of the plant and the dark brown stalk. This is one to enjoy as it flowers because it doesn't become unmanageable.

The geminiflora is also a great landscape plant. You don't have to fuss with pups, it stays small at 2-3' x 2-3', it's dark green and contrasts well with just about everything. But wait, there's more.

Here is an Agave that practically deserves its own column. This plant is in the perryi species. All of the plants in this species are blue/gray. One of these you may know and love is the Artichoke Agave.

The plant pictured here was about 3' x 3' when it sent up its stalk. I was stunned at the color contrast of the stalk and the base. When still in its early stages of growth, the stalk was as maroon as it appears in this photo.

As the stalk grew, it lost some of its color only to bring it out again in its buds, shown here. Look closely. When the flowers emerge, they are deep yellow. Quite a show, huh?

And, finally, no discussion of Agave stalks would be complete without mentioning the Octopus Agave (Agave vilmoriniana). These plants leave nothing to chance.

Instead of sending up a flower stalk and waiting for pollination to occur, this agave's stalk is made up of hundreds of bulbils or "plantlets" - perfect clones of the base plant. The stalk pictured here is in its early stages of growth but, even now, you could remove one of the plantlets and start a new plant. As you might imagine, these

stalks grow much more slowly than flowering stalks because the stalk itself needs to create all those plantlets.

And, in another really unusual twist, not all Octopus Agaves do this. Some send up a blunt flower stalk that, when it blooms, looks like a giant yellow pipe cleaner.

Pretty interesting plants, these Agaves.

The Bottom Line

So, why do Agaves aim high? Bats. Bats are Agaves' primary pollinators and scientists think that the height of agaves' flower stalks and their convenience to bats is an example of co-evolution. Bats may be primary but that doesn't leave bees and Hummingbirds out of the action. They like agave flowers, too, and are happy to help with pollination.

The Agaves featured here are only a few of the hundreds of Agave species that grow in the Sonoran Desert. Once you know of the variations from plant to plant, you'll also know what to look for in a blooming Agave. It just may be that your appreciation for these plants soars. Just like their stalks.

Paleo Stuffed Peppers

On a recent visit to Grayhawk, Steph and her significant guy made delicious stuffed peppers. I hadn't had stuffed peppers in years because my mom used to make them with

green peppers, which were not my favorite when I was young. So

when I came home from Arizona I decided to try to make a paleo version for my husband, using red and yellow peppers, which are much sweeter than green peppers. I also used lean ground turkey, substituted cauliflower rice for white rice, and did not top with cheese. Also, here is my biggest secret ingredient alert....any time I cook with ground meat, or make stews or pot roasts, I add a shot of vodka to help tenderize the meat just before I put a lid on the pot and simmer.

We have been trying to eat healthier and learned that a Paleolithic diet has many benefits such as improved heart health, increased energy and circulation, decreased

inflammation, and an added bonus of weight loss. Sometimes called the "caveman diet", eating paleo is really just about choosing organic foods low on the food chain, as humans ate for thousands of years prior to farming and the agricultural revolution. Many

people with diabetes, arthritis and auto-immune diseases have made drastic improvements in their well-being by switching to a paleo diet. Absolutely no sugar, dairy, grains, or legumes are allowed so it's really important to read labels carefully because sugar is often added to salad dressings, mayonnaise, chicken broth, canned tomatoes, and other sauces. We have found all of these

> items without added sugar at Whole Foods. Paleos can eat as much organic lean meat, fish, vegetables, and certain fruits as they like. Snacking on pistachios, cashews, almonds, walnuts and a variety of other nuts and seeds is also allowed. We have noticed that organic foods that are low on the food chain are much more filling than processed foods, and after a few days of clean-eating, we don't even crave sugary treats or dairy. However, we don't eat exclusively paleo, and we do allow ourselves cheat days to indulge in our favorite foods. I hope you enjoy these stuffed peppers and bet you won't even miss the rice and cheese!

Paleo Stuffed Peppers

Prep time: 30-35 minutes; Bake time: 30 minutes Servings: 3-4

Ingredients:

- 5-6 peppers, any color, hollowed out
- 2 lbs. organic ground turkey, or ground beef
- 1 14 ounce can organic chicken broth (no sugar)
- · 1 shot vodka (optional)
- 1 ½ cups uncooked cauliflower rice (in most grocery stores)
- 1 medium Vidalia onion, chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced

- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 tablespoon paprika
- 1 ½ teaspoon Himalayan sea salt
- 1 ½ teaspoon black pepper
- 1 14.5 ounce can diced tomatoes
- 1 6 ounce can tomato paste
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- parsley, chopped to garnish

Instructions:

- 1. In a large, deep pan, brown meat on medium high for 10 minutes, adding chicken broth occasionally to avoid burning. Brown and caramelize meat to increase flavor.
- 2. Add onions, cauliflower, garlic and other spices to meat and sauté 4-5 minutes on medium, stirring constantly until onions are translucent.
- 3. Add shot of vodka, and can of diced tomatoes, cover and simmer on medium for an additional 15-20 minutes to tenderize meat. Then mix in tomato paste to thicken. Set
- 4. While meat is simmering, add olive oil to skillet and heat to medium. Lightly char peppers for about 5-7 minutes turning frequently with tongs.
- 5. Stuff peppers with meat and vegetable mixture, and bake peppers uncovered in a baking dish at 375 in preheated oven for 30 minutes.
- 6. Garnish with parsley, serve with your favorite green or fruit salad and enjoy!

October is that time of the year when we can finally say goodbye to that last stretch of hot weather which brings with it our first hints of Arizona

fall. Football is in full swing and the World Series is fast approaching. I really love this time of the year. I am starting to remember why I love living here!

Those of you who really know me, know that I love the made up holidays that we dedicate to food throughout out the year. Did you know that this month we celebrate one of the most universal foods? It is one that is definitely a favorite of mine. October is National Pizza Month! It's time to celebrate all things crusty and gooey, thin and deep dish and everything in between.

Over the years I have reviewed a handful of pizza and Italian restaurants. But I don't think any has come with such a reputation of this month's featured restaurant. Grayhawk's Director of Communications Jennifer Sheets and I lunched at the one and only **Lou Malnati's Pizzeria**, which opened a location on Scottsdale Road in September of 2018. I thought that I had dined at every pizza place in Chicago with all my visits there, but I was definitely wrong! Many Grayhawk neighbors and friends of mine speak so highly of **Lou Malnati's** that I had to give it a try.

Phoenix is the leading shipping destination for **Lou Malnati's** frozen pizza delivery service Taste of Chicago. That would explain why in 2016 Arizona became the first expansion state for **Lou Malnati's Pizzeria**, which now has about 53 locations in metro Chicago and three in Arizona.

I was born in Chicago, but never got a chance to know the city as a child. As an adult, I have enjoyed visiting Chicago over the years. I recently read about the background of Lou Malnati, his family and his many pizzerias. Considered the oldest family name in Chicago pizza, **Lou Malnati's** has been a Chicago institution for over 45 years. Lou Malnati opened the original **Lou Malnati's Pizzeria** in Lincolnwood, Illinois on March 17, 1971. On opening day, people lined the street just to get a taste of his now legendary deep dish pizza.

The **Lou Malnati's** in Scottsdale is their largest Arizona pizzeria to date. The 10,000 square feet pizzeria offers dine-in, carryout and delivery. The restaurant features an indoor/outdoor space with garage doors opening up to a large patio and two private dining areas for group reservations. Design elements include petrified palm trees and vintage Chicago posters. It's super cozy and fun.

I know, you are probably worried or concerned about the pizza in Scottsdale tasting the same as it does in Chicago, but have no fear because their recipe and ingredients is exactly they same. They ship in the mozzarella cheese from the same Wisconsin dairy that has supplied their pizzerias with delicious cheese for over 40 years. The Scottsdale pizzas will still be topped with their exclusive California vine-ripened tomatoes. They are even bringing in their Chicago water! Rick Malnati, Lou's youngest son, "swears that their water is what makes our dough so downright

delicious." When they opened their first pizzeria in downtown Phoenix, they worked with a company to replicate the pH level of Chicago water, which they believe is essential to producing the taste they all know and love. They're doing all of this because they believe that a slice of Lou's pizza in Phoenix and Scottsdale should taste the same as it does in Chicago.

After looking at the menu briefly, we decided to split a pizza and a salad. There are two deep dish specials. They do offer thin crust, but Jenn insisted we order deep dish as it is their specialty, although





both of us were apprehensive not being fans. We chose The Malnati Chicago Classic and were not disappointed. It was made with Lou's lean sausage, cheese and vine-ripened tomato sauce on ButtercrustTM. We split the Malnati's Salad which was made with romaine lettuce, tomatoes, black olives, mushrooms, salami bits and gorgonzola cheese with their Sweet Vinaigrette dressing and Romano cheese. Jenn especially loved the salad. It was simple but absolutely delicious. I think it was the dressing that made it.

The pizza was also great. I am pretty sure I'm a deep dish convert! Jenn commented that she was surprised how crunchy the crust was and how much she actually did like it, having had previous bad experiences with deep dish. Even though I am a cheeseoholic, it was a tad too much cheese for me. I did notice that Jenn also pulled a bit of cheese off. To be fair, we were warned (it said "extra cheese" right in the description). We ordered a small that was sliced into four pieces. We each had one slice and Jenn took the other two back to the office to share. It was truly the flaky Buttercrust that made the pizza so yummy. I can see why it's popular.

Next time, I think I will order *The "Lou"* which is a deep dish pizza with spinach mix, mushrooms and sliced roma tomatoes covered with blend of mozzarella, Romano and cheddar cheese on garlic Buttercrust. They also have other great appetizers, soup, salad, sandwich, pasta and dessert menu options. Happy Hour is Monday through Thursday from 3-6 pm and features beer, wine and appetizer specials. I highly recommend you go check it out if you haven't been there. Until next month, enjoy the fall!
