Manager's Corner



This month I felt it was important to remind homeowners about the importance of following the correct procedures when making exterior modifications to your property. As most of you know, if you are making alterations or improvements to the exterior appearance of your property, you must receive prior written approval from the Architectural Review Committee.

Even though you may have seen a similar modification at another house within Grayhawk, do not assume that you can do the same type of modification to your property. For example, there are light fixtures and courtyard gates that are approved in some neighborhoods but not approved in other neighborhoods.

This is largely dependent upon the architecture and design of the houses within the neighborhood. Approved color schemes also vary depending upon the neighborhood.

Many times at Architectural Review Committee meetings there are a number of the modification submittals for changes to the property that had already taken place, and the homeowners were notified that they were in violation of the covenants because they had an unapproved modification on their property. While generally these modifications are eventually approved by the Architectural Review Committee, while generally modifications that are already completed are not approved and the homeowners either have to remove the modification or make changes to the modification to bring it into compliance. This results in an additional expense to the homeowners which could have been avoided if the homeowners had just called additional expense to the homeowners which could have been avoided if the property to get information the Grayhawk Community Association office prior to making the change to their property to get information about the modification approval process. Please do not let this happen to you.

On another note, we have noticed an increase in the amount of vandalism that is being found by our roving patrol officers and the association staff during our inspections. Locks are being tampered with on the mailbox structures, pool furniture is being thrown into the pool, community walls are being defaced with graffiti, tables at the ramadas have been damaged, and damage has been done to roof tiles at several ramadas in the community.

Vandalism of this nature takes time and money to repair, which is paid for by you as Grayhawk homeowners if we do not catch the vandals. The Scottsdale police have been involved in several of these vandalism incidents and we will make the responsible party pay for any damage to association property if they are caught. Please let the Grayhawk Community Association office or one of the guardhouses know if they are suspicious behavior or anyone vandalizing association property. With your help, hopefully we can alleviate these types of problems.

We'll talk again soon.

Grayhawk Master Association Board of Directors Meeting – August 5, 2019

GUEST

Representatives from ADOT attended the meeting to provide a presentation which provided an overview and construction update for the 101 Freeway widening project as well as the new bridge at the Miller Road connection along the 76th Street alignment south of Thompson Peak Parkway.

DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

David Van Omen reported that there is still no information on a new business going into the former Tavern Americana location in the Hayden Peak Crossing shopping center. Michael Fee reported that YAM Properties, which owns the Grayhawk Plaza shopping center at Scottsdale Road and Grayhawk Drive, contributed \$5,000 toward the Rawhide Wash Letter of Map Revision Project.

OPERATIONAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

Richard Zielinski reported the committee met last month. Pete Day with Trident Security provided and update to the committee on the recent vandalism and car burglaries. The two individuals responsible for the vandalism were apprehended and the car burglaries were all listed as crimes of opportunity as the vehicles were left unlocked and no break-ins occurred. The gate reader transition went well with no major issues at all seven gates.

Barry Ebert with Santa Fe Management provided and update on the Guardhouse Remodel Project. He has recommended an architect for the project, Keith Zollman of Studio KZ, after in depth interviews with several architects.

A motion was made to approve Keith Zollman for the initial design of \$32,000.00 to be funded by the GCA community enhancement fund.

LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

Arlene Smith reported that the committee did not meet.

DLC reported some minor damage due to monsoon winds. General seasonal maintenance continues. Board approved projects have been completed or in progress

- 1) Thompson Peak Wash, South side in progress
- 2) Thompson Peak Wash, North side completed
- 3) Deer Valley Wash Erosion –in progress
- 4) Priority Sidewalk Edges & Culvert Headwalls completed
- 5) Windsong Park Erosion completed
- 6) Grayhawk Vegetation & Drainage Area 1 & 2. –completed
- 7) Sierra Pinta Tennis Court Erosion completed
- 8) Venu Wash Erosion Repair completed
- 9) Arbor Crew scheduled the 3rd week of every month, to address tree issues beyond onsite crews scope.

Bob Mann reported that the committee did not meet.

EVENT PLANNING COMMITTEE

Sarah Van Duyne reported that in June and July events held were Time for Teens gift card collection, RENT @ ASU Gammage, Night at the Movies, Ladies Night Out, Ice Cream Social and VIP 'Behind the Scenes' tour of the Musical Instrument Museum. All were well attended.

In August, there will be a Child and Babysitting Safety Certification Class, Pinspiration Vision Boards, Brunch & Bubbly and a New Resident Orientation.

COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE

Michael Loya reported that communication met recently to discuss Projects/Goals for 2019.

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

Paul Alessio reported that the committee had met three times and had 23 submittals which included window replacements, exterior lighting, roof tile replacement, garage doors ramadas, security cameras and pavers.

BUDGET/FINANCE COMMITTEE

Jeanette Griswold reported that the committee did not meet but will be scheduling a meeting with the GCA and RVA auditor in August.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

David Van Omen reported that the committee did not meet.

Advanced Painting submitted a proposal for this year's painting project at a cost of \$87,443.42 (\$80,761.95 for the Park section and \$6,681.47 for the Avian common area wall). This cost is the same price per linear foot as the previous proposal for these neighborhoods in 2014. This expense would be funded through the GCA reserve fund. A motion was made to approve the proposal.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Jeanette Griswold reported that the GCA is slightly over budget for the year primarily due to an increase in the water expense. Almost \$85,000 was collected in community enhancement fees in June and approximately \$361,000 has been collected in community enhancement fees in 2019

MANAGEMENT REPORT

Mike Fee reported that the Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) approval from FEMA regarding the reclassification of the Rawhide Wash floodplain in Grayhawk became effective on June 14. The GCA has notified the affected homeowners.

DLC Resources has completed the seasonal pruning for the year throughout the community.

The new stone has been installed at the monument sign located on the NW corner of Thompson Peak Parkway and Pima Road, Scottsdale Road and Thompson Peak Parkway, the two signs at Grayhawk Drive and Scottsdale Road, Hayden Road and Deer Valley Road, and the two signs at Hayden Road and Thompson Peak Parkway. The new stone has also been installed on the neighborhood monument signs in Montevina, Windsong, Pinnacle, and Coventry at Grayhawk sign on Grayhawk Drive. The stone caps on these signs are scheduled to begin being installed during the week of August 5. Graphic Directions, Inc. has submitted a new "mock up" of the signs which include the Grayhawk hawk on the neighborhood monument signs, which are scheduled to be installed along with the new lettering during the week of August 12. The next phase of this project will be the renovation of the monument signs in the Talon Retreat.

Association Reserves began their reserve study update in June and should have their updated report completed in August prior to the 2020 budgeting season.

INVESTING IN OUR COMMUNITY

This fall, Scottsdale voters will have the opportunity to vote on three bond questions put forth by the City of Scottsdale that contain 58 projects in the following categories:

- Parks, Recreation and Senior Services: 14 projects, \$112.6 million
- Community Spaces and Infrastructure: 20 projects, \$112.3 million
- Public Safety and Technology; 24 projects, \$94.1 million

To determine what projects citizens thought were most important, Scottsdale city staff conducted six open house meetings, and accepted online comments from the public in the spring. The total cost for all 58 projects is \$319 million.

If Scottsdale voters pass all three bond questions in November, there will be several projects that will affect the Grayhawk area including a Dog Park being built near the SW corner of Hayden Road and Thompson Peak Parkway, Thompson Peak Bridge being expanded to four lanes, and infrastructure repairs which will be funded allowing Scottsdale to maintain its reputation as a world class city which enhances property values.

The City of Scottsdale's Treasurer has confirmed that the annual secondary property tax (which services bond debt) for a Scottsdale resident would NOT increase if the three bond packages are approved.



The bonds can be issued in stages as existing bonds are paid off, ensuring that the city's secondary property taxes will stay at or below current levels. The estimated average annual tax rate for the proposed bond authorization is \$0.2877 per \$100 of limited assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes. Voters have not passed a significant bond package since 2000.

The election process will be via mail-in ballot only. Every registered voter in Scottsdale will be mailed a ballot in early October for the November 5 election date. The ballot will not list the individual projects or their costs, but that information is available on the City of Scottsdale website.

Projects are spread throughout Scottsdale and range from repairing lakes and irrigation systems on Indian Bend Wash to building new and renovating existing public safety and recreation facilities. Pointy Objects

If you'd told me 5 years ago that I'd be writing a column about cactus spines, I'd have gently recommended that you consider a rubber room. Who would write about such a thing? Who, indeed.

As it turns out, cactus spines are pretty fascinating. They serve a useful purpose. They come in all sizes, shapes and colors. They look great when wet and if you can catch them with the sun behind, they are to die for.

Once upon a time, Cacti had leaves and, at least one species of *Opuntia* (Prickly Pear) still does. But, over about 10,000 years or so, these plants began to adapt and change. As our once-tropical environment shifted to becoming a desert, cactus leaves morphed into spines.

There are lots of spiny plants in the plant kingdom; not all of them are cacti. Many of our native trees and shrubs have spines, for example. And there are many species of succulents that sport spines, but not all of them are cacti. Cactus spines emanate from areoles.

Cactus areoles are unique in the world of spiny plants. These circular bumps on a cactus produce spines, flowers and the dreaded glochid; more about that in a minute.

The Argentine Giant (*Echinopsis candicans*) pictured here has easy-to-see white areoles which create great contrast with the plants' bright green skin and its golden yellow spines. When these spines are back-lit by the sun, they are gorgeous.

Speaking of being back-lit by the sun, take a look at this.

This is an otherwise ho-hum barrel cactus. You would walk by this one 10 times out of 10 without noticing it.

With the morning sun behind it, though, all of its spines stand out in full relief. They are different lengths and different shapes and they are full of yellow, maroon and gold against a dark green skin.

The areoles on this one aren't apparent but you can easily see how the spines are clustered together in little groupings. The areoles are responsible for this arrangement.

And, here is our new friend, the Cordón. This "aerial" shot allows you to see all of the new spine growth and clearly see the areoles. At this stage, the spines are two-toned - almost maroon at the base bleeding to white.

Lovely geometry, huh?

Our discussion of pointy objects would not be complete without the Teddy Bear Cholla (pronounced CHOY-ya). As some of you have learned the hard way, segments of a Teddy Bear Cholla are weakly attached.

They've been accused of "jumping" by more than one hiker or the occasional inexperienced dog. They don't jump but they also release themselves with little provocation. But that's not what makes these plants interesting. What's interesting is (you guessed it) their spines.

Their spines shimmer in the sun regardless of the sun's angle on the plant. Why? Their spines are virtually pearlescent. Each spine reflects light from every angle. Look closely and you can see the flesh-colored areoles against the pale green skin in this up close shot of a Teddy Bear Cholla.

But, just look at what the sun does when it hits this plant. Is that gorgeous, or what? Note, too, this Cholla's offspring littering the ground.

What Good Are Spines?

Think of spines as cactus armor. They are a form of self-defense. Browsing animals are generally put off by spines, with the exception of Javelina and their particular affinity for consuming Prickly Pear. Doesn't that hurt?

Spines also protect cactus stems from sun - at least a little. Oddly, there are many cacti that can grow here but aren't fond of the blazing sun on 115-degree days. These are the ones that are

native to cooler environments, like the upper elevations of the Chihuahuan Desert, for example. And if they're not adapted to these conditions, they will burn; Argentine Giants bleach to a sickly shade of yellow in truly hot conditions - spines or no spines.

Spines are also pretty good at deflecting hail which protects delicate cactus skin from injury. And, there are many native birds that are attracted to these plants. Cactus Wrens, White Winged Doves and Gila Woodpeckers hop all over spiny plants. They love them

The Dreaded Glochid

While cactus spines are often beautiful, glochids are not. Glochids are nasty and can be dangerous. Once you get them embedded into your skin, you can feel them but you can't see them unless you can hold the affected area up to direct sunlight.

You can remove them but only with perfect vision or an excellent eye glass prescription. To see one clearly, you'd need a microscope. If you can catch them in the sunlight, you can pull them out, one at a time with a tweezer.

If you can't see them to tweeze them, you'll have to endure their being in your skin for two or three days until they finally work their way out.

Glochids are hair-like and barbed. Think of an arrow with a really sharp tip and barbs down its length. And, since they are a form of spine, they can be found on the areoles of many cacti. If you didn't know they were there and you touched the areole with your fingers, you would feel them for days.

If all of that weren't enough, glochids transfer very easily from a cactus onto your skin, into your gardening gloves, onto your clothes and, well, you get the idea.

I have a pair of heavy leather gardening gloves that had glochids on the fingers and the gloves promptly transferred some of them to my own fingers, right through the leather. The solution? Tweeze out as many as many as possible and replace the gloves because the transference will continue.

Clearly, the only thing worse than getting glochids in your fingers, hands or arms, is getting them in your lungs. THAT should be avoided at all costs.

The Bottom Line?

When it comes to cactus spines, it's always wise to remember your mom's admonition, "Look, but don't touch," at least not without the proper tools and protection.

Come back next month when we'll be focusing on another feature of a single plant type: Agaves and their stalks.
